



Ad hoc Local Project Supporters

The Role

As part of the County Development Team, you will introduce new young people and adults to Scouting by delivering the Six Week Challenge. Following the challenge, you will support and mentor new volunteers to enable new sections and groups to establish and run independently.

Purpose

To support the development of Scouting in Greater London Middlesex West and create more opportunities for young people.

The Team

Led by the County Development Officer, the team consists of 1 permanent Development Assistant and a number of Ad hoc Local Project Supporters.

The County Development Officer reports to The County Trustee Board and County Lead Volunteer

Tasks

Lead the GLMW 6 week challenge programme in line with objectives set at outset

Lead the Day of Adventure at either PACCAR or Walter Davies

Support delivery beyond 6 week challenge

Administer OSM

Set up volunteer Whatsapp group

Report progress to County Development Officer

Identify potential volunteers

Mentor and build confidence of new volunteers

Programme planning

Skills & Qualifications

A current member of The Scouts

Current DBS

Up to date mandatory training (including First Aid)

Good communicator

Experience of leading a section

Able to lead an exciting and energetic programme

Ability to work with little supervision

Good knowledge of The Scout onboarding process

Familiar with OSM

Remuneration

A minimum of 3 hours per week at an agreed rate.

Reasonable travel reimbursements (agreed at outset)

This is not an employed position. The project supporter will invoice GLMW on a six weekly basis

Commitment

Minimum of 3 hours per week (allows for section meeting and associated planning/admin time)

1 weekend during the initial 6 week at Day of Adventure (this will usually be a Sunday). This will be a maximum of 6 hours

Minimum of six week commitment and availability to support for a further 6 weeks if challenge successful

Any extension of support agreed on rolling six week basis
