
How many of our section leaders have completed the wood badge for their role?

In 2019 we ran...


- <u>Two days each of</u>: Our Organisation, Working with Adults, Great Programmes, Supporting Young People (all in weekend format)

- One Skills for Residential Experiences weekend course
- All the training took place at PACCAR




In 2020 we are planning to run...

- Three days each of: Our Organisation, Working with Adults, Great Programmes, Supporting Young People (some in weekend format, some as individual days)
- Three Introduction to Residential Experiences days
- Two Leadership and Management weekend courses
- One Skills for Residential Experiences weekend course
- About half the days will be at PACCAR with increased places
- Other days will move around the County
- The places available on the most popular (and most required) courses will double







The course on Saturday 12 October...



42 people signed up, with 3 on waiting list

On Saturday morning we expected 32

3 people never showed up and we ran the course for 29

Sent joining instructions 4 weeks ahead

3 more people dropped out, but 1 more signed up

29 leaders had a great time and each completed 4 modules

11 people dropped out, but the 3 waitlisted all got a place

A week before the course we have 34 people

We ran a course at 69% capacity, and invoiced the Districts £120


