GLMW Kandersteg Expedition 2025

Early on Tuesday, 12th August, 2025, the first fifty Scouts, Explorer Scouts and Leaders from GLMW will begin the checking-in at London's Heathrow Airport. Over the following eleven hours, some 650 participants will follow them on a journey via Zurich or Geneva, on aeroplanes, trains and buses along the beautiful Kandertal valley to the Kandersteg International Scout Centre.

Their camping equipment and personal baggage will have arrived ahead of them, carried by two of the largest available, hard-walled, articulated trucks full to the roof with tents, rucksacks, cooking equipment and much, much more.

On arrival, the travellers will be greeted with a meal and will then head across the road to set up their campsites among the trees and rocks of the KISC camping grounds at 1,200m above sea level and at the foot of the 2,770m Innerer Fisistock mountain peak.

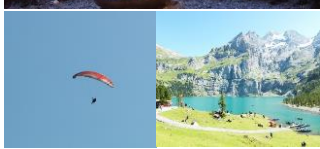
An opening ceremony will follow and over the next ten days, they will participate in a wide range of alpine activities that are beyond the experience of the majority of young people in the UK. Some will climb high in to the mountains of the Bernese Oberland, walk on glaciers and snowfields, descend in to ice crevasses. There will be opportunity to spend nights in high alpine mountain huts and walk to remote mountain valleys. Some will try white water rafting on the racing headwaters of the river Lütchine starting just below the world famous North face of the Eiger. Some leaders might parascend from the cliffs of the Kandertal valley. Lots of them will visit the villages of Gruyere or Spiez to observe the making of well-known Swiss cheeses or Swiss chocolate or to travel by boat on the beautiful Lake Thun to the famous spa town of Interlaken.

GLMW has a long Expedition History

Every four years GLMW organises an expedition open to all Scouts, Explorer Scouts and Adults within the County. The Expedition aims to deliver an exciting international experience to many young people who may otherwise not be able to participate in such an opportunity.

County are able to experience activities in the high Alpine environment. You will hear them talk about camping and hiking in the high alps, walking and climbing on snowy mountains, high ropes hanging way above an Alpine valley,





white water rafting, swimming in a mountain lake, day trip travel to Italy, meeting a wide range of international visitors to the Centre, visits to the many cultural attractions of the Bernese Oberland region of Switzerland and tell stories of how they participated in community support projects on mountain railways or in Alpine villages.

GLMW has been delivering such expeditions for many years. This expedition represents the culmination of over two years planning and preparation. A team of around seventy people will staff the expedition led by a central organising team of five who are already at work to ensure a successful outcome. **We hope that you will be able to join us on this great adventure.**

Kandersteg International Scout Centre

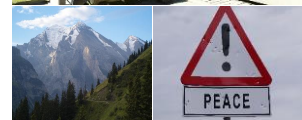
Kandersteg International Scout Centre is the World Centre of the World Organisation of the Scout Movement (WOSM). The Centre began in 1923 with Lord Baden-Powell, who, after the first World Scout Jamboree, had a dream about creating a place where Scouts from all over the world could meet: the Permanent Mini Jamboree. His dream came true and still today tens of thousands of Scouts from all over the world meet every year at this historic campsite sharing the values of the World Scout Movement.

The centre is run mostly by a staff who work on a volunteer basis. Drawn from all over the world, the centre provides an opportunity for young people to learn about and operate a large international activities facility. 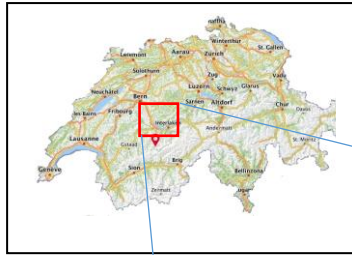
Activity and Programming at KISC

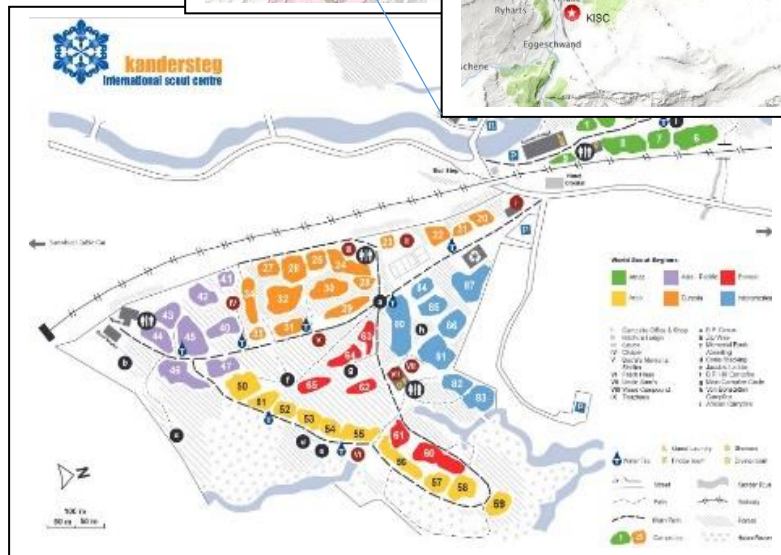


Where is Kandersteg?



Kandersteg is in the Bernese Oberland region in the Canton (or state) of Bern. We will be travelling by plane to Geneva or Zurich.

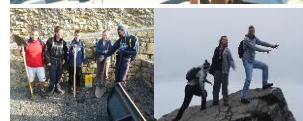
From the airport, we will travel by train to Bern. At Bern, we change train to reach Kandersteg.



The Kandersteg International Scout Centre (KISC) is located south of the main village.

From the campsite at KISC, you have access directly into some of the most beautiful Alpine scenery in the world. The village of Kandersteg is just a fifteen-minute walk away. By train from the local station, you can be by the stunningly beautiful Lake Thun in around 45 minutes. Alternatively, a southbound train can take you to the Rhone Valley and connections for a day trip to Italy.

Walking up into the mountain valleys, you will hear the sound of music ringing from the bells attached to local sheep and cows as they wander their summer pastures high above the village.

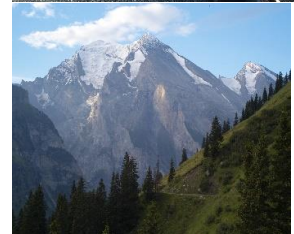
If you want to be a member of the Staff Team for the Expedition

Baggage Transport for the Expedition
