"20in20" The GLMW Challenge for 2020

A great new challenge award for which everyone in the County can participate is here. With a badge that can be achieved by every member of every section from Beavers all the way through to Explorers, this is an exciting way to add new interest and opportunities to our programme for the year. There is even an award badge for all of our adults in GLMW from leaders, commissioners and executive committee members too.

The idea for this badge came directly from our young people. In 2020, the County Programme will be very much a Youth led experience. One of our Cubs, when completing his Postcard for Bear this summer said, "If I was Chief Scout I would give everyone 20 challenges ... to complete in 2020...". Among hundreds of really great ideas, we thought



that this was one of the best and have made it a central element of our County programme plans for the year. There will be lots of opportunities to achieve the challenges throughout the year. With badges available at a subsidised rate from the County, this is an ideal aid to planning your section and district programmes in 2020.

Monitor Your Progress on OSM

There are personal record cards that you can download and print, we have arranged for the award levels to be available as a

badge on OSM so that everyone can even e-track their own progress through the year.



There are challenges that fit with everything that we can already do in our great weekly programmes across the County so the awards can work for everyone. From Camping and Cooking to Hiking, making fires, helping to reduce plastic pollution to Zorbing, there is something for everyone to achieve. There is great flexibility in every one of them so reasonable adjustments can be made for everyone to take part. To see the challenges for yourself, you can find them on the County Website 20in20 Challenge Page. For example, climb 100 metres for one of the Scout Challenges could be achieved by doing lots of climbing sessions with ropes and climbing walls, walking up some hills in the Chilterns or even by having a sponsored stair climb in a London tower block.

Take your Progress with You

If a young person moves section during the year, they can take their 20in20 progress with them to their new section. So if they have completed 16 challenges already, they will still have only 4 remaining to achieve in their new section and they will get the badge for the section that they are in.

And Our Adults have a Badge to aim for too...

We didn't want the adults in the county to miss out so if your over 18 and have a determination to get involved, there is a set of 20 challenges for you to. We hope that you are ready for 20in20 and look forward to seeing and hearing about the ways you make it happen across GLMW in 2020.
